

Pamela Cowl

A Knitting Kninja design

Sir Philip Sidney created the name Pamela for his poem “Arcadia” out of the Greek roots *pan* (all) and *meli* (honey) to mean all honeyed. Pamela is a simple and honey sweet lace cowl knit in the round with a roll neck edge. A good pattern for the beginning lace knitter, or anyone who wants a fast, easy, and satisfying knit. The suggested yarn, a merino/silk blend, feels incredible on the neck!

SIZE

17.5 inches in circumference, 11.5 inches in length

MATERIALS

- * 150 yds DK weight yarn
Shown in Malabrigo Silky Merino [50% silk, 50% merino, 150 yds per 50g skein, 1 skein used in color Sand]
- * 16 inch U.S. size 6 (4 mm) circular needle
- * stitch marker
- * tapestry needle

GAUGE

21 sts and 24 rows = 4 inches

ABBREVIATION KEY/STITCH GUIDE

- BO:** Bind off
- CO:** Cast on
- K:** Knit
- K2tog:** Knit two together
- ktbl:** Knit through back loop
- LH:** Left hand
- P:** Purl
- PM:** Place marker
- pssso:** Pass slipped stitch over
- Rep:** Repeat
- RH:** Right hand
- Rnd:** Round
- sl:** Slip
- Ssk:** Slip one knitwise, slip one purlwise, knit together through back loops
- st(s):** Stitch(es)
- yo:** Yarn over





Directions:

CO 92 sts, pm, and join to knit in the round, being careful not to twist sts.

Rnds 1-4: K.

Rnd 5: *K2tog, yo twice, ssk; rep from * around.

Rnd 6: *K1, (ktbl, k1), k1; rep from * around.

Rnd 7: As Rnd 5.

Rnd 8: As Rnd 6.

Rnd 9: Remove marker, sl 2 sts from LH needle to RH needle, replace marker; *k2tog, yo twice, ssk; rep from * around.

Rnd 10: As Rnd 6.

Rnd 11: As Rnd 7.

Rnd 12: *K1, (ktbl, k1), k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, sl last 2 sts to RH needle, remove marker, sl 2 sts back to LH needle, replace marker.

Rep Rnds 5-12 until cowl measures approximately 11 inches from CO edge.

K 4 rnds.

BO.

Finishing:

Steam block lightly to open up lace pattern. Wear and enjoy!
